

The regular meeting of the Kinderhook Township Board was called to order by Paul Meredith on Monday, June 25, 2007 at 7:30 p.m. at the Kinderhook Township hall. The pledge was recited to the American flag. All members were present.

The minutes were accepted as printed.

Citizen Comments:

Floor was opened at 7:33. Residents of Indian Shores expressed concerns over a lawn that needs to be cut, excess firewood stored on property, unlicensed cars, loud noise and speeding. Floor was closed at 7:50 p.m.

Commissioner's Report: Norm Heinemann gave a brief report.

Sheriff's Report: The sheriff's department will address the issues raised from the residents of Indian Shores with additional patrols.

Treasurer's Report:

Castor reported June's expenses of \$47,614.55, revenues of \$5,927.26 with cash on hand of \$289,693.86. Barnes moved to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills. Newby seconded. Motion carried.

Zoning Report:

Three permits were issued and fifteen zoning complaints.

Old Business:

McKenna Associates reviewed our Zoning Ordinance and presented their findings to a joint meeting of the Planning Commission, ZBA and Township board on Thursday, June 21st. The most important part of the review was ZEA compliance. The Planning Commission will go over the report in detail at their next meeting.

New Business:

Township hall repairs and maintenance: The front of the building needs painted. The following people will be contacted to see if they'd be interested in doing the work: Larry Wilms, Oliver Walters and Milt Smith. Parking stops – The consensus was to hold off on adding parking stops until later. Gravel – Terry Huss will be asked to spread the gravel in the back of the building.

Barnes moved and Stetler seconded to purchase one carton of Safco portable art and drawing portfolios to store our township maps. Motion carried.

The clerk will send a thank you note to Jayann Avery at Chicago Title for the donation of the conference table.

Quarterly budget review – there are no adjustments for this quarter. However, the special assessment for Sellers Drive is already in arrears. A letter will be written to the residents indicating that there will be no dust control next year in order to bring the account back into balance.

Barnes moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Stetler. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
