

The regular meeting of the Kinderhook Township Board was called to order by Paul Meredith on Monday, July 30, 2007 at 7:30 p.m. at the Kinderhook Township hall. The pledge was recited to the American flag. All members were present.

Citizen Comments:

Floor was opened at 7:35. A comment was made about the cutting of lawns that were reported at the last meeting. Floor was closed at 7:40 p.m.

Commissioner's Report: Norm Heinemann gave a brief report.

Sheriff's Report: No report.

Treasurer's Report:

Castor reported July's expenses of \$34,408.91, revenues of \$19,938.09 with cash on hand of \$275,223.04. Stetler moved to accept the Treasurer's report and pay the bills. Barnes seconded. Motion carried.

Zoning Report:

Three permits were issued and there were six zoning complaints.

Old Business:

No bids were received on painting the township hall. Meredith will make some contacts.

New Business:

Paul Beckhusen from CBPU addressed the board on the CBPU Hazardous Waste Collection that will take place on October 20, 2007. The cost of the event is approximately \$60,000 and asked the board if they would consider a donation to offset the cost of Kinderhook Township's residents participation. The board tabled their decision until the August meeting.

MTA District meeting. Newby and Meredith will attend.

The sexton addressed the board on the problem of overgrown trees and shrubs in the cemeteries. The Cemetery Ordinance states that no trees or shrubs are to be planted and that the sexton can remove any of the foregoing items planted. Most of the trees and shrubs were planted before the ordinance was adopted, but the board concurred that he should remove or trim the plantings as he sees fit.

Stetler moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Barnes. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.
